Regulations:

- All Level 1 Politics and Modern History (PMH) students will be automatically enrolled on HIST10101 History in Practice (20 credits) (List A)
- All Level 1 PMH students will be automatically enrolled on POLI10202 Introduction to Comparative Politics (20 credits) (List A)
- All Level 1 PMH students will be automatically enrolled on POLI10601 Introduction to International Politics (20 credits) (List A)
- All Level 1 PMH students will be automatically enrolled on POLI10702 Introduction to Political Theory (20 credits) (List A)
- All Level 1 PMH students must choose 40 additional credits of optional course units (Lists B and C)

After following Steps 1 to 3 below, all Level 1 PMH students must have:

- Total selection of exactly 120 credits
- Minimum of 50 credits of course units in each semester
- Maximum of 70 credits of course units in each semester
- Course units whose lectures do not clash – **check the timetable**

Note on Credit Allocation Across Semesters:

- The semester in which a course unit is taught is identified by the last digit in the course code (e.g. HIST10101 = semester 1). A 0 (zero) final digit indicates the course unit is taught across both semesters
- When calculating your credit allocation by semester, the credits for **0** (zero) coded courses should be divided equally between semester 1 and semester 2

Please note that swapping or dropping full-year optional modules is prohibited after week 2 of semester 1.
