PLEASE NOTE:

When selecting your course units you must ensure you take:

- 120 credits overall (including any compulsory courses)
- Minimum of 50 credits per semester
- Maximum of 70 credits per semester
- Minimum 100 credits must be Level 1
- Maximum 20 credits at Level 2 (students at Level 1 are not normally permitted to take Level 3 credits)
- Please note that, in addition to the course units listed below, you will be automatically enrolled onto the following non-credited course units by your Programme Administrator: **SALC11320 Health and Safety Induction; SALC11250 Wellbeing and Diversity; SALC11260 Academic Malpractice**, and **RELT10000 Peer-Assisted Study Sessions**
