**PLEASE NOTE:**

When selecting your course units you must ensure you take:

- **120 credits overall**
- Minimum of 50 credits per semester
- Maximum of 70 credits per semester

**ADDITIONAL NOTES:**

- In order to progress to the second year of the programme, it is necessary to pass your compulsory core language unit with a mark of 40 or above. It is also necessary to pass at least 60 more credits with a mark of 40 or above, and a further 40 credits with a mark of 30 or above. You must pass at least 40 credits at the first attempt (i.e. not through resits). Please see your School Handbook for more information.

**HELPFUL HINT:**

- ✓ The semester a course is taught in is identified by the last digit in the course code. E.G CLAH30220. A '0' identifies the course unit is taught over both semesters, a '1' indicates Semester 1 and '2' indicates Semester 2
