### Regulations:

- All Level 1 History and Russian (HRUSS) students will be automatically enrolled on HIST10101 History in Practice (20 credits) and RUSS10251 The Making of Modern Russia (20 credits)
- All Level 1 HRUSS students **without** A-level or equivalent in Russian will be automatically enrolled for RUSS51011 Russian Language 1 (20 credits) and RUSS51022 Russian Language 2 (20 credits), and will **select 40 credits** of optional course units (Lists B and C)
- All Level 1 HRUSS students **with** A-level or equivalent in Russian will be automatically enrolled for RUSS51030 Russian Language 3 (20 credits) and RUSS10242 100 Years of Revolution (20 credits), and will **select 40 credits** of optional course units (Lists B and C)

### After following Steps 1 to 4 below, all Level 1 HRUSS students must have:

- Total selection of exactly 120 credits
- Minimum of 50 credits of course units in each semester
- Maximum of 70 credits of course units in each semester
- Course units whose lectures do not clash – **check the timetable**

### Note on Credit Allocation Across Semesters:

- The semester in which a course unit is taught is identified by the last digit in the course code (e.g. HIST10101 = semester 1). A 0 (zero) final digit indicates the course unit is taught across both semesters
- When calculating your credit allocation by semester, the credits for 0 (zero) coded courses should be divided equally between semester 1 and semester 2

Please note that swapping or dropping full-year optional modules is prohibited after week 2 of semester 1.
