After completing your selection, you must ensure that you have chosen:

- a total of 120 credits
- a minimum of 100 credits at Level 1 or higher
- 60 credits in each named subject
- a minimum of 50 credits per semester
- a maximum of 70 credits per semester
- no more or no less credits as stated from each list

Helpful hints:

- ✓ All courses are 20 credits unless otherwise stated
 - ✓ Course codes ending in '1' are taught in the first semester, those ending in '2' are taught in the second semester, and those ending in '0' are taught over both semesters
- Please check the timetable for courses you choose to ensure that you do not have any clashes

3.Minor or Free Choice Units

As a single honours student you have the option to study a [Minor subject](#) alongside your single honours Major subject.

Alternatively, in discussion with your Academic Advisor, you can choose up to 40 credits free choice from across the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures, or up to 20 credits from within the Faculty of Humanities or University College.

Please note that subject combinations are subject to availability and timetabling constraints.

3a: Choosing a Minor (0 – 40 Credits)

Please select the relevant course units for the Minor, ensuring that you choose all 40 credits.

3b: Choosing Free Choice (0 – 20 Credits)

Alternatively, in discussion with your Academic Advisor, you may choose Free Choice units from more than one subject.

No more than 20 credits per year can be taken outside of the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures; therefore at least 20 credits of your free choice must be pre-fixed by one of the following course unit codes (you cannot take more than 20 credits free choice from the **same** subject area, with the exception of SALC/LALC):

AHVS; AMER; ARGY; CHIN; CLAH; DRAM; ENGL; FREN; GERM; HIST; ITAL; JAPA; LALC; LELA; MEST; MUSC; REES; RELT; SALC; SPLA

A further 20 credits can be taken from another subject area in the School of Arts Languages and Cultures, or from within the Faculty of Humanities or University College (please see note below regarding LEAP). No more than 20 credits of Free Choice units per year may be taken outside of the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures.

Students studying at post A-level language can select **LEAP** course units (units offered by the University Language Centre) and must be applied for directly with the LEAP office. Your performance on this unit will be monitored, and, where relevant, you may be advised to discontinue with the study of the additional language in the subsequent year of study at the recommendation of your Academic Advisor or Programme Director.
