### PLEASE NOTE:

When selecting your course units you must ensure you take:

- 120 credits overall (including any compulsory course units)
- Minimum of 50 credits per semester
- Maximum of 70 credits per semester
- All courses are 20 credits unless stated otherwise.
- **You can take maximum 20 credits at Level 2.**
- **You can take a minimum of 40 credits and a maximum of 80 credits of English Language course units.**
- We would encourage you to discuss your course unit options with your Academic Adviser.
- Please check timetable details for units you choose to ensure that you do not have any clashes!

### HELPFUL HINT:

- The semester a unit is taught in is identified by the last digit in the course code: e.g. CLAH30220. A '0' identifies the course unit is taught over both semesters, a '1' indicates Semester 1, and '2' indicates Semester 2
