Each code is broken into four letters identifying the subject area and 5 numbers which identify both the Level (year of study) and the Semester the course unit is offered in.

The first numerical digit in the code shows the Level it is taught at:

- 1 = First year
- 2 = Second year
- 3 = Third year

You should usually take course units which correspond with your current year of study e.g. second years take 2**** numbered course units and final year students take 3**** course units.

The semester a course is taught in is identified by the last digit in the course code

- 0 = Year Long course (Course runs from the 22nd September 2014 – 08th May 2015)
- 1 = First semester (Course runs from the 22nd September 2014 – 12th December 2015)
- 2 = Second semester (Course runs from the 26th January 2015 – 08th May 2015)


