PLEASE NOTE:

When selecting your course units you must ensure you take:

- 120 credits overall (including any compulsory courses)
- Minimum of 50 credits per semester
- Maximum of 70 credits per semester
- Minimum 100 credits must be Level 3
- Maximum 20 credits at Level 2

ADDITIONAL NOTE:

- Students in MLBM Italian may take up to 20 credits per year out of the total of 120 as a free choice from course units within the Faculty of Humanities, provided that the required number of credits is taken in their MLBM programme. This may include one LEAP language unit (20 credits) in either or both of the second and final years, as long as in any one year no more than three languages are studied. However, a LEAP language unit may only be taken as a free choice unit in the final year if a prerequisite LEAP unit in the SAME language has been taken in the second year.

HELPFUL HINT:

- ✓ The semester a course is taught in is identified by the last digit in the course code. E.G CLAH30220. A '0' identifies the course unit is taught over both semesters, a '1' indicates Semester 1 and '2' indicates Semester 2

- **BMAN21040** Intermediate Management Accounting may be taken in the final year (as the 20 credits of Level 2 units allowed) provided that the prerequisite BMAN10632 (Fundamentals of Management Accounting) has been passed in year 2.
