Our Backers

Our main start-up funder is the **Education Endowment Foundation** (EEF), chaired by Sir Peter Lampl of the **Sutton Trust**.

We work closely with **Teach First** and **PwC**, who helped to design our tutor recruitment process.

Our Primary Pilot received funding from the EEF, Shine and Manchester City Council. We have also received funding commitments from The Oglesby Charitable Trust. Our offices are provided by Bruntwood. Pro bono business support is provided by PwC and MACE.

National Foundation for Educational Research

All of our work is being qualitatively and quantitatively evaluated by the NFER. When assessing Year 11 GCSE maths pupils, it found that in less than 3 months of tuition students "attained on average 2 GCSE maths points higher than their peers", equivalent to a third of a grade. For D/C borderline students, such improvements often translate to gaining a C grade at GCSE.

Summer Schools

Over 200 pupils leaving Year 6 took part in our 2013 Summer Schools, which were run with Manchester City FC, Manchester United FC and Lancashire County Cricket Club. Five schools took part in 6 weeks of programmes. While refreshing numeracy and literacy skills, the Summer Schools helped students settle into their new secondary schools.

Looked After Children and Vulnerable Students

number of Greater Manchester authorities. Paul Anderson, Head teacher at **Hurst Knoll St. James' CE Primary**, told us: "The caring attitude shown by two tutors working with a Looked After Child has helped him gain confidence, improve his behaviour and encourage his learning."

We have also provided tuition at Pupil Referral Units and not-for-profit institutions for children outside mainstream education. In some cases, we have even helped pupils reintegrate back into school.

We are particularly proud of this aspect of our work, and are delighted to have assisted these vulnerable young people as they gain confidence in themselves and achieve more academically.

Coding Pilot

In March 2014, we launched a pilot of Coding tuition in partnership with the **University of Manchester** and **Manchester City Council**.

Over six weeks, we worked with nearly 100
Year 5 pupils in three Greater Manchester
schools. Pupils focused upon the logic and
thought processes common to all coding
languages, providing them with essential skills
for working with multiple programming
languages and their wider future education.

On completion of the course, Joseph Allen, a tutor, said: "The students' reactions to learning to code are incredible, they are so ambitious, involved and creative. It's impossible to show up without a smile on my face."

Tutors

Since 2012, we have recruited and trained nearly 600 tutors, with almost 450 currently working for us. All tutors are university students or graduates, mostly from the University of Manchester, Manchester Metropolitan University, the University of Salford and the Royal Northern College of Music.

Our tutors all receive two and a half days of training, are insured, and undergo a DBS check. All training is led by qualified teachers and teacher trainers. During their work with The Tutor Trust, we provide tutors with constant support, additional training, and personal and professional development opportunities. Regular Quality Audits are also conducted to assess the quality of tutors' lessons. We are consistently impressed with their imagination and dedication, proving they are not just good tutors, but excellent role models.
