The structure of the BASS programme ensures that all our graduates appreciate the advantages of taking a holistic perspective on social life and are equipped with a broad range of achievements.

You will have learned to weigh the advantages and disadvantages of different theoretical and methodological approaches throughout your training. A BASS degree fosters intellectual and practical skills that enhance graduate employability.

By now you will have developed a set of cognitive skills and competencies, personal capabilities as well as technical abilities that are transferable to new environments.

Of those we highlight the following:

 The ability to identify problems, solve them and draw conclusions about them. This includes the ability to analyse, to exercise critical thinking, to use one's judgement and to pay attention to details as well as the whole picture.

- Our graduates develop excellent skills in communication. This includes writing and oral presentation skills, the ability to use arguments to persuade, sensitivity to different disciplinary and other perspectives, listening, questioning and pitching a message to different audiences.
- A BASS degree enables graduates to develop emotional intelligence that will equip them with dealing with a variety of situations and contexts. This includes self-awareness, flexibility, working under pressure, the ability to work alone and in teams, working creatively, 'thinking outside the box' and strategic planning skills.
- A Manchester graduate leaves with the ability to work with different technologies.

With these transferable skills, students of the Social Sciences have enjoyed working in a variety of sectors: charities, international development organisations, local government, diplomatic services, market research, advertising, civil service, educational institutions, museums, social work, newspapers, public relations, recruitment, health management and legal aid.

Many move to higher education and specialise through post-graduate degrees.
