





The benefits

- Graduate employers look for candidates with work experience, practical skills and professionalism

- Gain practical experience alongside your studies
- Build your confidence and develop a real-world attitude to business
- Earn a salary, gain increased responsibility and independence
- Create a network of contacts and subsequent job opportunities
- Gain an insight into a particular role and employer leasing to more informed career choices
- Tuition fee discount: You would receive a significant fee reduction for your placement year – Home/EU students pay a maximum of £1,800 (with further support available to those from lower household incomes) and international students pay half the standard international fee

- Assessment & student support centre, disability support office plus many others


