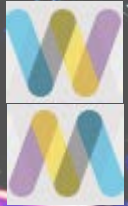

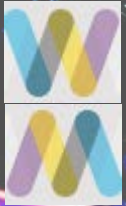

- The Volunteering and Part Times Job Fair on 30th September will now be ONLY for part time jobs.

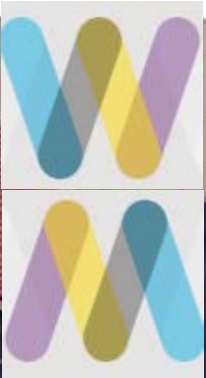

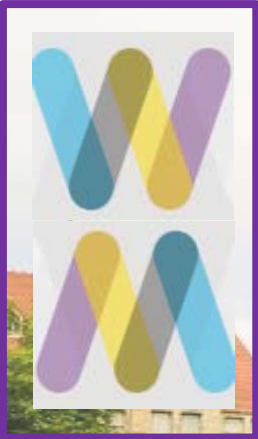

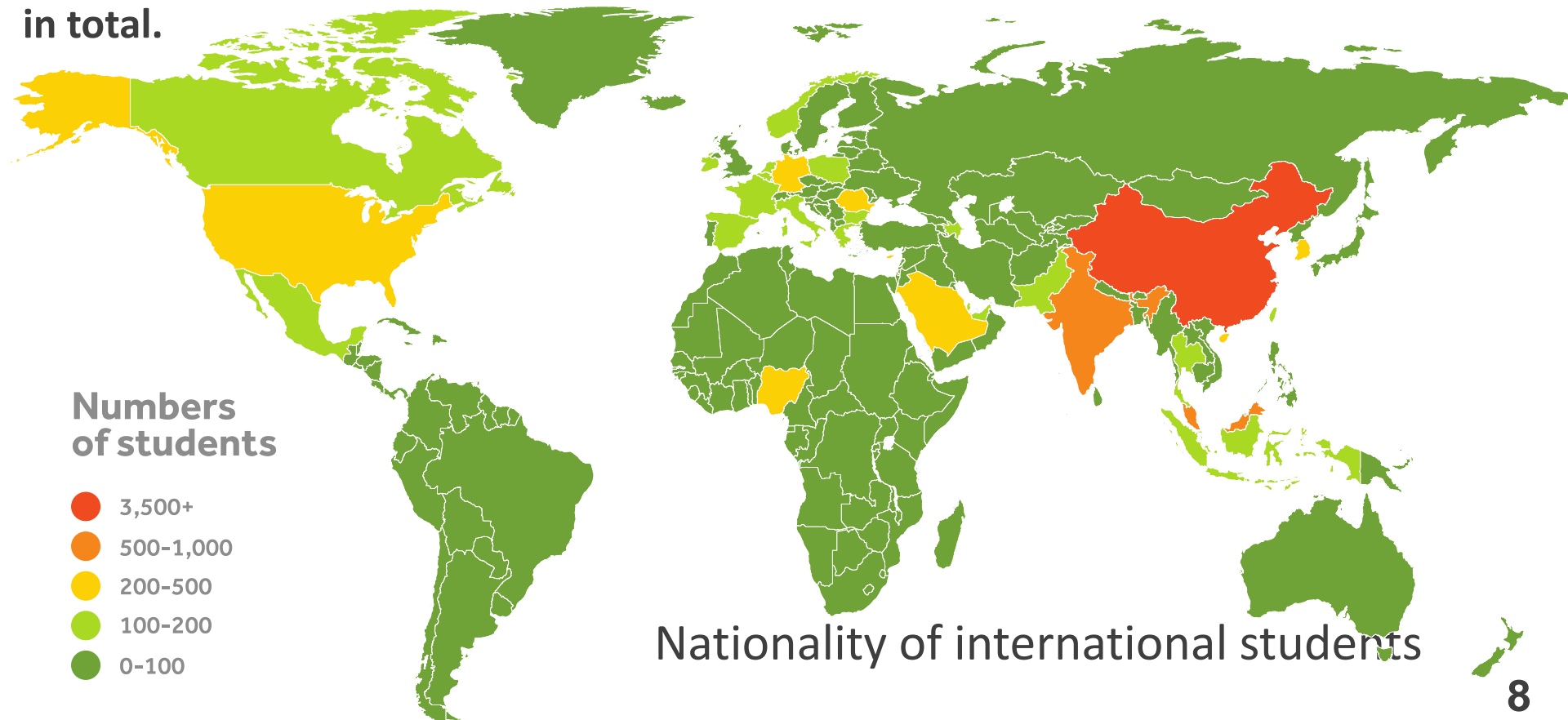




An international Institution

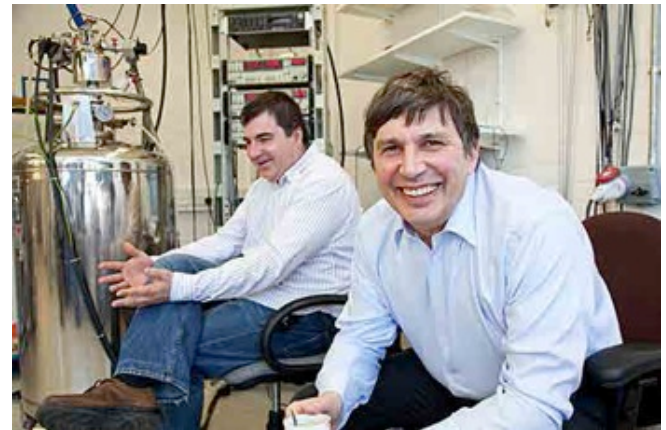
Each year we welcome more international students than any other UK university, expect 10,000 + in 2015.

Your Tier 4 visa status requires that you MUST:

- **attend all timetabled classes, attend meetings with your tutors and any others sessions at the University;**
- tell your School immediately of any temporary absences (including illness) – so they are always aware of your situation
- tell your School immediately if you plan to interrupt your studies, withdraw from your course, or change your programme of study/research – so that your student record can be updated and the UKVI informed of any changes

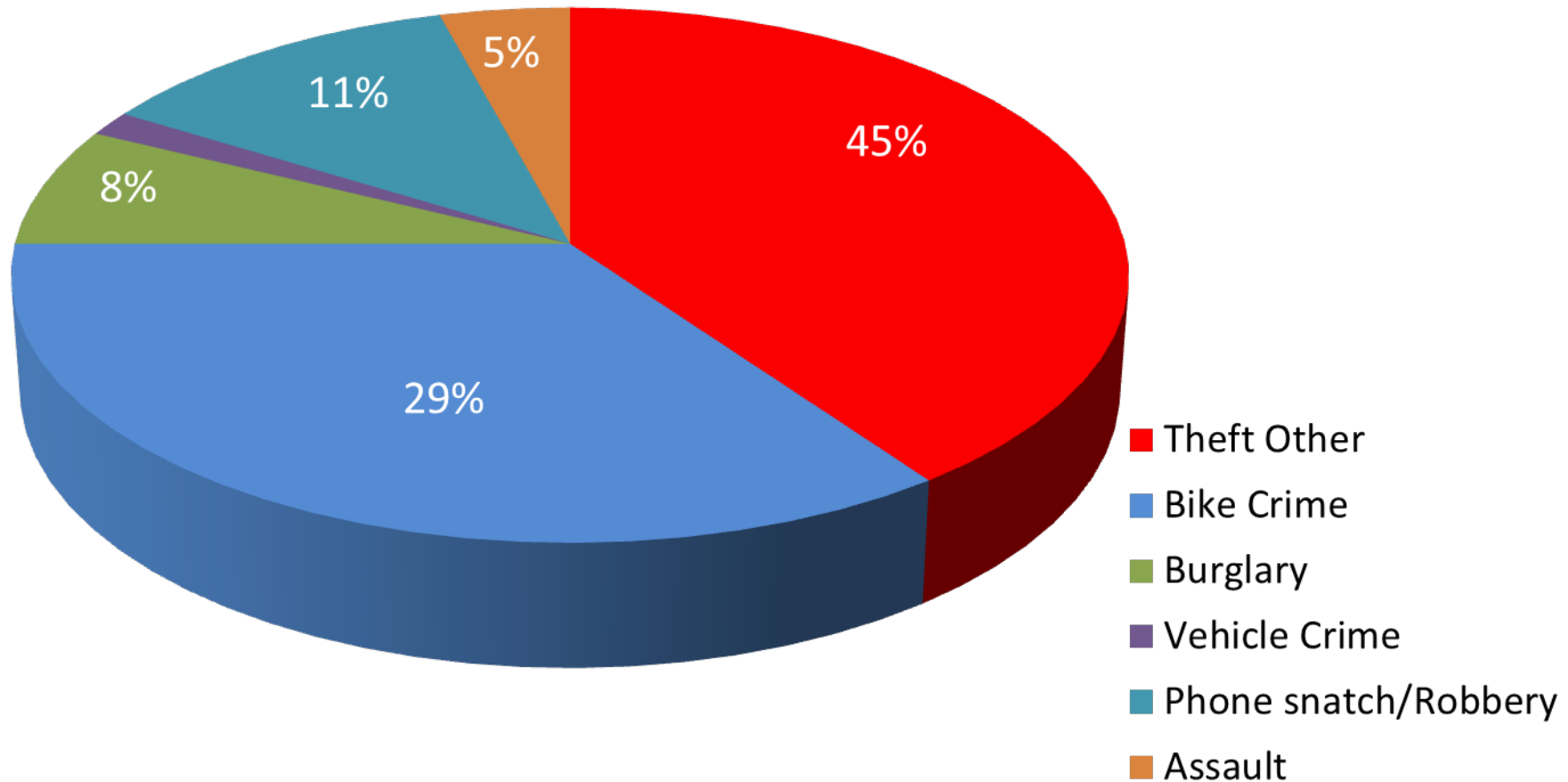

A £45 Gold Standard 'D' LOCK FOR £10

Poor bike locks account for 99% of all cycle thefts on campus

To get your Gold Standard Lock for £10

- Register your bike details online – bit.ly/1nkCjOc
- To buy a lock go to the University's online shop – bit.ly/1orulBb
- You will see two locks on offer one at £10 and the other at £15
- Select the £10 lock you will then be asked for three things
 1. Your University student/staff ID number
 2. A reference number which is P0001A
 3. The password Devonshire35

Crime Reduction Advisor Services

The Crime Reduction Advisor (CRA) is responsible for the provision of security advice and guidance to students and colleagues in various University departments. The CRA monitors crime on the University campus and formulates initiatives to prevent and respond to offences.

The CRA provides the following services:

- Cycle Registration Scheme.
- Subsidised Lock Initiative.
- Property Security scheme.
- 'Now you see it' awareness campaign.
- Crime Awareness Inputs/Events.
- Monitoring crime patterns.
- Advise students/staff of increase in particular crime types.
- Provide up to date news in relation to crime.
- Liaison for Project Managers on both new build and refurbishment projects.
- Maintain the Crime Reduction web site.
- Update the Crime Reduction Facebook site.
- Liaison with the Police.



Between 23 June 2015 and 4 July 2015 a man approached a number of people as they sat at table in coffee shops and restaurants in the city centre.

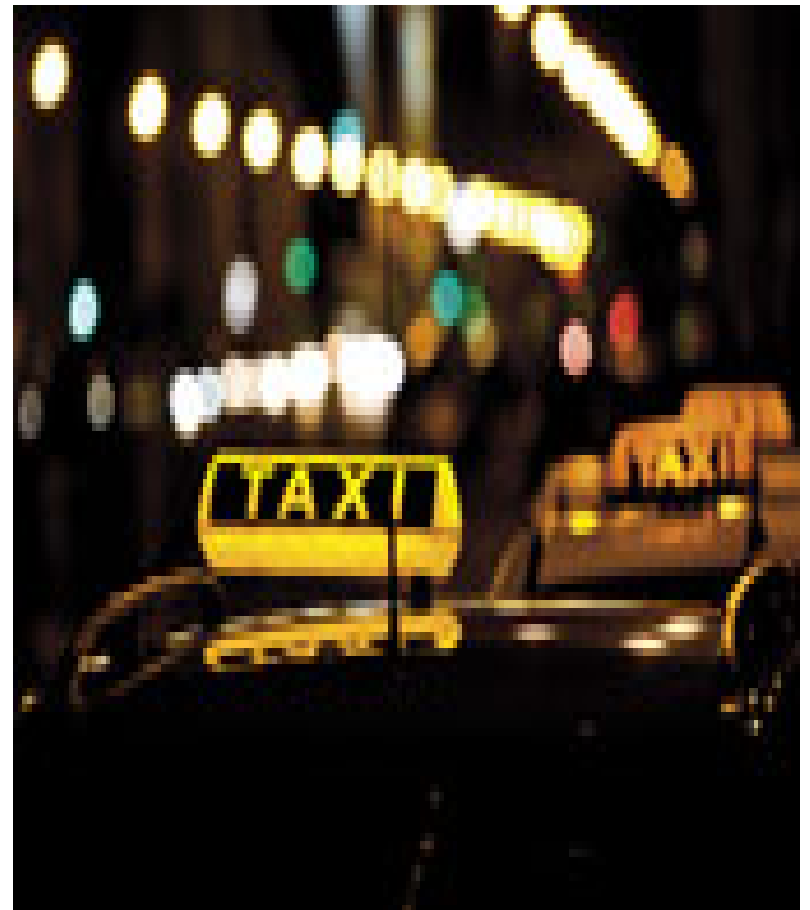

Personal Safety



- Remember to keep your windows/doors locked when you are not at home
- Don't let anyone in to your room/home that you don't know
- Keep your personal belongings safe

Money

- Only carry ONE cash card
- Do not use cash machines at night. Plan ahead and get your money out during the day
- Do not carry large amounts of cash around with you- Open a bank account ASAP
- Be aware of any suspicious activity when using the cash machine- Distraction theft
