Planning your day

As you make your way through the programme and start to plan your day, you will see that next to the building names/session venues there is a number in brackets. This indicates the building number as listed on the campus map on pages 28-29 and will help you to navigate around our campus. If you are having any problems on the day in finding a building please ask a member of our open day team dressed in purple and they will be happy to direct you.







Alternatively a tram service to Piccadilly Gardens runs from Victoria Station. You can then catch one of the bus services mentioned above. Taxis are also available outside the station.

Travelling from Oxford Road Station?

To get to the Oxford Road Campus, go down the station approach to Oxford Road and turn right. The Campus is a 10 to 15 minute walk. Alternatively, you can catch a bus from outside the Palace Hotel to the Oxford Road Campus. Please speak to one of our Student Ambassadors who will be based at Oxford Road Station.




