



# WHAT IS A PGCE?

**PGCEs are a route to train to teach and recommendation for qualified teaching status (QTS) for those who already have an undergraduate degree.**

You need QTS to teach in a state-maintained or special school in England and Wales. Whilst other routes to gain QTS are available, they do not all come with the postgraduate qualification of a PGCE.

On completion of your PGCE and being granted QTS, you will work for a year as a newly qualified teacher (NQT). Following completion of your NQT year, you will be a fully qualified teacher.



## HOW WILL I LEARN?

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The structure of our PGCEs includes both school-based and university-based learning. Studying a primary PGCE with The University of Manchester means that you will spend a significant amount of your time in primary schools on placements. On our secondary PGCEs, around two thirds of your time will be spent in secondary schools, academies and colleges on placements.

The University's partnership schools are highly committed to giving you the best possible experience whilst you are on your school placements, giving you the opportunity to put into practice all the knowledge you have acquired from sessions held at the University.

The remaining time will be spent at the University, for example in lectures and seminars, including group-work. On the secondary PGCE, you will work in subject specific groups.

You will also need to undertake self-directed study in the evenings and weekends, such as background reading, creating lesson plans and completing written assignments. A PGCE is a challenging qualification but the reward can be a long and successful career in a highly-valued profession.

## OVERVIEW

**This PGCE will train you to teach children aged 5 to 11.**

**It provides training in all primary stage National Curriculum subjects, with a particular focus on mathematics, English and science.**

**Completion leads to a postgraduate qualification and recommendation for qualified teacher status (QTS).**



## HOW WILL I LEARN?

A significant amount of your time will be spent in schools developing practical teaching skills. You will observe and teach classes under the guidance of an experienced primary teacher. You will also have a mentor to help you to plan lessons and develop your marking and assessment skills.

University-based sessions cover education theories, ideas and concepts, and will enhance your awareness of current educational issues. You will spend a significant amount of time studying the core subjects of English, mathematics and science. You will also study: religious education; PE; history; geography; art; music; and design and technology.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- A 2:1 or above honours degree from a UK university, or an equivalent qualification. Applicants with a 2:2 honours degree may be considered and must be able to demonstrate evidence of higher academic attainment, e.g., through non-vocational postgraduate study.
- Two A-levels at grade C or above.
- Minimum grade C at GCSE (or equivalent) in English language, mathematics and science, plus GCSE grade C in at least three other subjects.
- Applicants whose first language is not English: IELTS 6.5 overall, 6.5 in writing and no sub-section below 6.0.

**This PGCE will train you to become a biology teacher across the 11-16 or 11-18 age range. It will prepare you to teach the National Curriculum and related national strategies, GCSE and A-level.**

**Completion leads to both a postgraduate qualification and recommendation for qualified teacher status (QTS).**



## HOW WILL I LEARN?

Approximately two-thirds of your time will be spent in schools and colleges developing your practical teaching skills. You will observe and teach classes under the guidance of an experienced science teacher and mentor, improving your skills in planning, teaching and assessment.

University-based sessions will enable you to reflect on teaching methods. Experienced teachers will work alongside PGCE tutors, plus visitors from exam boards and the Society of Biology. Some sessions are run with the University's science departments to benefit fully from the University's resources, and also with Manchester Museum and the Museum of Science and Industry in Manchester.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum 2:2 honours degree in a biological science with at least half of the content strongly related to biology.
- Grade B in biology at A-level (or equivalent), or grade C if you can demonstrate sustained academic progression since A-level, and at least one other science or maths A-level.
- Minimum grade C at GCSE (or equivalent) in English language and mathematics.
- Applicants whose first language is not English: IELTS 6.5 overall, 6.5 in writing and no sub-section below 6.0.

- Minimum grade C at GCSE (or equivalent) in English language and mathematics.



Approximately two-thirds of your time will be spent in schools and colleges developing your practical teaching skills. You will observe and teach classes under the guidance of an experienced modern language teacher and mentor, improving your skills in planning, teaching and assessment.

University-based sessions will enable you to reflect on teaching methods. We are dedicated to developing your expertise and we believe passionately in the benefits of creative, motivating and engaging language lessons in order to create the next generation of lifelong language speakers.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- A strong academic record at A-level (or equivalent) and at degree level including a 2:2 honours degree or above. If you are not a native French speaker, 50% or more of your degree content should have focused on French.
- You should also be able to speak a second language (German or Spanish), beginners' level will suffice.

All universities interview candidates for PGCE courses. We aim to notify you of our decision within 40 working days of receiving your application.

### INTERVIEW

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Interviews are normally held between November and April on our Oxford Road campus in Manchester. The interview process takes place over a half day, and includes the following:

- An introductory talk from University lecturers
- Identity and qualification checks – please bring with you photographic ID (such as your passport or driving licence), proof of address and copies of your academic qualifications
- A personal interview with one of our tutors and a teacher from a partnership school
- Primary PGCE applicants will be asked to deliver a short presentation; details of which will be given when you are invited for interview
- PGCE Secondary applicants will be asked to conduct a short teaching task and complete a subject knowledge assessment

### RE-APPLICATION

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If you have applied to us previously but your application was not successful, you may apply again. # SCHOOL DIRECT

## WHAT IS SCHOOL DIRECT?

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The University of Manchester is working with a number of primary and secondary schools in Greater Manchester to offer the School Direct route into teaching. School Direct allows schools to recruit and select their own trainees with the expectation that they will then go on to work within the school, or group of schools, in which they were trained, although there is no guarantee of employment.

School Direct trainees follow a PGCE course structure but on a modified timetable including increased contact with their School Direct school. It is important to request details of the modified timetable from the School Direct lead school you are interested in applying to in order to fully understand the modifications. Trainees who successfully complete their chosen programme will be recommended for the qualification of PGCE School Direct and a recommendation for qualified teacher status (QTS).

## WHO CAN APPLY FOR SCHOOL DIRECT?

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Both School Direct salaried and non-salaried training routes are available. The salaried route is an employment-based route and you will earn a salary whilst you train. Applicants for the salaried School Direct route must hold a good honours degree (2:2 or above) and have at least three years' work experience. Applicants for the non-salaried School Direct route must hold a good honours degree (2:2 or above).

## PROFESSIONAL SKILLS TESTS

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You must pass the Professional Skills Tests that all applicants to teacher training courses are required to sit prior to commencing your PGCE. The professional skills tests assess the core skills that teachers need to fulfil their professional role in schools, rather than the subject knowledge needed for teaching. This is to ensure all teachers are competent in numeracy and literacy, regardless of their specialism.

We will give preference to those applicants who have passed their skills tests at the time of interview however we will interview those who have not yet passed their tests.

## SUBJECT KNOWLEDGE ENHANCEMENT COURSES

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If you would like to teach maths, physics or physics with maths but your skills in this area need strengthening, our subject knowledge enhancement courses may be for you. They are intensive eight week courses designed to be studied before a PGCE to raise your knowledge of maths, physics or physics with maths up to GCSE level. You may also reach the standard required to teach to A-level. The courses are assessed by a portfolio of work and there are no formal examinations.

To be eligible you must have been made a conditional offer of a place on a PGCE course from an initial teacher education (ITE) provider, such as The University of Manchester. There are no tuition fees for UK or EU students and you may be entitled to a bursary to help towards your living costs whilst studying the course.

## RETURNING TO EDUCATION

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The PGCE student community includes students of all ages, coming to us from years of work experience from a variety of professional fields or directly from undergraduate study. The variety of our students' backgrounds and experiences enriches seminars and group-work, allowing you to learn from your fellow students as well as your tutors and placement mentors.

The prospect of returning to education can seem daunting, but every year we help adult learners succeed in their aspirations to train to teach, supporting you in adapting the life skills gained through previous careers to skills in the classroom.

## THE TIME COMMITMENT
