



Why are we inviting you back with your children and family?




We're the Gallery in Whitworth Park with art inside and outside! Try our welly walks, green guide or have an art picnic in our garden.


Visit us near Macclesfield and explore the wonders of the Universe and the giant Lovell telescope, take part in our events and trails.
