SECOND YEAR

THE SECOND YEAR

Students on the Second Year of the PPE degree take **40 credits from each Discipline Area**. This is non-negotiable.

ECONOMICS – COMPULSORY CORE

Students must choose a 20 credits from the following 10 credit courses:

ECON20351: MICROECONOMICS IIA

ECON20352: MICROECONOMICS IIB

ECON20401: MACROECONOMICS IIA

ECON20402: MACROECONOMICS IIB

You can take either both Microeconomics, or both Macroeconomics, or both of the “IIA” courses.

PHILOSOPHY – COMPULSORY CORE

Students must take 20 credits from the following 20 credit courses:

PHIL20042: FORMAL LOGIC

PHIL20231: ETHICS

**PHIL20242: 20TH CENTURY ANALYTICAL
PHILOSOPHY**

PHIL20951: AESTHETICS

POLITICS - COMPULSORY CORE

Students must take one of the two following 20 credit courses:

POLI20881: IDEALS OF SOCIAL JUSTICE

POLI20961: CHALLENGES FOR DEMOCRATIC POLITICS

IN ADDITION...

Students must take **a further 20 credits from each discipline**, which may come from the compulsory core courses, or from the lists of available options.

Because there are so many options on the timetable for PPE students, it is not always possible to avoid clashes.
Students cannot take courses that clash with each other.

From 2.00-3.00, there will be lecturers from the three disciplines on hand to talk about the courses available. Please do drop-in and chat with them in the Arthur Lewis Common Room.

COURSE UNIT SELECTION

- Course Unit Selection opens in July, date to be confirmed.
- Students are asked to complete their selections by 8th August.
- Course Unit Selection is done on the Student System (not Blackboard).
- Early selection is recommended because, once the room limit is reached, the courses will close. You then have to join the Waiting List. **Popular courses fill up very fast!**

CHANGES TO COURSE UNIT SELECTION

- Make your selection as early as possible, making sure that you have no more than 70 credits in one semester, and no less than 50 credits.
- Subject to the availability of places, changes can be made up to the end of the second week of teaching in each semester.
- Changes cannot be made after you have submitted any assessed work for a course.

STUDYING ABROAD IN SEMESTER TWO

Students who are studying abroad in Semester 2 should take advice from their Study Abroad Co-ordinator.

Most students try and take their compulsory courses in Semester 1, so that they have more choice when they are abroad.

Politics and Philosophy will allow students to do alternative assessments, if they have to go abroad before the examinations have taken place.

Economics do not offer alternative assessments, and students come back to Manchester in the Resit Period to take their Economics examinations.

- **CHOOSE YOUR COURSES EARLY...**
- **YOU CAN CHANGE COURSES, AS LONG AS THEY HAVE SPACES, UP UNTIL THE END OF THE SECOND WEEK OF LECTURES IN BOTH SEMESTERS.**
- **BEING ON A WAITING LIST DOES NOT GUARANTEE A PLACE ON A COURSE – HAVE A PLAN B.**
