## 40 credits of core courses:

### Plus:

- A further 80 credits, including at least 60 credits from the sociology options
- Leaving you 20 credits of free choice, which can be:
  - ✓ an additional course from the sociology optional courses
  - ✓ a unit from another Social Science discipline (Politics, Economics, Social Anthropology, Philosophy, Social Statistics)
  - ✓ a unit from another School (e.g. Arts, Languages and Cultures), **with permission from Sociology Programme Director**
  - ✓ a unit from University College, **with permission from Sociology Programme Director**. Optional 10 or 20 credit modules that use interdisciplinary teaching to tackle the grand challenges faced by the world today.
- You should balance your workload fairly evenly between the two semesters (i.e. 60 credits per semester).
- **Total: 120 credits**
