**PLEASE NOTE:**

**After completing your selection, you must ensure that you have chosen:**

- a total of 120 credits
- a minimum of 80 credits at Level 2 or higher
- a minimum of 40 credits in each named subject
- a minimum of 50 credits per semester
- a maximum of 70 credits per semester
- no more or no less credits as stated from each list

Course unit enrolment checks are completed from start of teaching until the end of week two. Students who have not following the guidance within the programme structure could find that units they wish to take are no longer available.

**Helpful hints:**

- ✓ All courses are 20 credits unless otherwise stated
- ✓ Course codes ending in '1' are taught in the first semester, those ending in '2' are taught in the second semester, and those ending in '0' are taught over both semesters
- ✓ Please check the timetable for courses you choose to ensure that you do not have any clashes

**Step 1:**

Select a minimum of 40 credits up to a maximum of 80 credits from List A (with at least 20 credits in both Chinese and Japanese Studies courses).

Students may take up to 20 credits in Chinese, Japanese or Korean language modules, provided they are a second-language learner of the chosen language and enrol in an appropriate level class, as assessed by the relevant instructors and based on the previous highest class taken in that language.
