Step 2: Post A Level German

Student's studying German at Post A-Level will be automatically enrolled on to the following course units detailed in LIST POSTA by our Programmes Administration Team.

LALC10030 is taught across many languages. You will be assigned to specific language seminars according to programme and language proficiency. If you have an A-Level in both your chosen languages you may have a choice of which seminar to take (Please see 2a).
