

SIGNING UP FOR LECTURES AND TUTORIALS

A guide for BSocSc Politics & International Relations

In the first year, you will be required to take **120 credits**, as follows:

You will find that you have already been enrolled on the above 80 credits. All of these courses are mandatory. However, you will be in Tutorial 0 (TU00). This is a holding tutorial, and you will need to move yourself out of it into a live tutorial as soon as possible. Details on how to do this can be found below.

You can use your **40 credits of free-choice units** to take courses from outside the discipline of Politics. Unless you are taking a Language Course, this must be a First Level course (i.e. the numeric part of the course code must begin with a "1") and it must also be **Open to All Students**.

*Please note that Introduction to Comparative Politics runs in semester 1 and semester 2. You can take this compulsory course in either semester (but not both). You have been automatically enrolled onto the semester 2 version (POLI10202) but can change this to the semester 1 version (POLI10201) if you wish. To do this select the 'Swap' tab on the enrolment system.

LANGUAGE COURSES

If you want to take a Language Course, you need to apply to the LEAP Office. Your level will be assessed and, if you are accepted onto a Language Course, you need to take no further action.
