

SIGNING UP FOR LECTURES AND TUTORIALS – A GUIDE FOR SOCIOLOGY STUDENTS

In the first year, you will be required to take **120 credits**, as follows:

You will find that you have already been enrolled on the above 60 credits. All of these courses are mandatory. However, you will be in Tutorial 00. This is a holding tutorial, and you will need to move yourself out of it into a live tutorial as soon as possible. Details on how to do this follow.

If you have only selected a further 40 credits (above) you then have to sign yourself up for a **further 20 credits of free-choice units**. Unless you are taking a Language Course, this must be a First Level course (ie. the numeric part of the course code must begin with a "1"). It must also be **Open to All Students**.

LANGUAGE COURSES

If you want to take a Language Course, you need to apply to the LEAP Office. Your level will be assessed and, if you are accepted onto a Language Course, you need to take no further action.
