2. APR UPDATE

A few days ago (Monday 7 November 2016), we had the Annual Performance Review (APR) for the PSS, where the PSS Leadership Team meet with Nancy and Senior Leadership Team (SLT) to review our performance over the past year and look forward to the challenges and opportunities that are likely to be presented in the year ahead. I will give you a full report on the APR in next month's CoreMunicate, but I can tell you that I reported to the meeting that PSS colleagues have continued to make a significant contribution to the University's overall success and progress towards meeting its Manchester 2020 goals. In the past year, the PSS has also delivered some significant change projects, including our critical role in the creation and support of the new Faculty of Medicine, Biology and Health. Whilst delivering change is not without its challenges, we have made a significant contribution to both improving the effectiveness and increasing the efficiency of the University.

Looking ahead, we discussed the need to generate additional income and realise greater efficiencies across the University in order to provide financial headroom to invest in the University's strategic priorities. It was recognised that the PSS would make a major contribution to University-wide changes such as the Student Lifecycle Project and by identifying opportunities for greater efficiency contained in the Cubane Benchmarking data. Such an ambitious agenda can, however, only be successfully delivered with the engagement, sponsorship and support of a wide range of academic colleagues. Nancy concluded the meeting by thanking all PSS staff for their contribution and commenting that: "We are fortunate in having within the PSS some acknowledged leaders in the sector and a team that works really well together."

3. CHANGES TO PSS LEADERSHIP TEAM

Pauline Morgan has taken on the role of Interim Director of Planning following the departure of Helen Barton who has taken up a new role at Manchester Metropolitan University. Russell Ashworth (Director of Faculty Operations in Humanities) has been appointed to the new position of Director of the Programme Management Office working on the delivery of Manchester 2020. Dr Andrew Walsh will take on the role of Interim Director of Faculty Operations in Humanities until a permanent replacement for Russell is in place. Andrew will continue with oversight of his current responsibilities as Director of Research and Business Engagement Support Services during this period. Finally, Alan Ferns has been appointed Associate Vice-President for External Relations and Reputation and will take up his new role on 2 January 2017, when he will step down as Director of Communications and Marketing. Recruitment of a new Director of Communications and Marketing will commence shortly and Terry Hudghton, Head of University Marketing, will serve as Interim Director until the permanent Director takes up the post.

4. 10,000 ACTIONS

On Thursday, 10 November the University launches the biggest environmental sustainability initiative in higher education – 10,000 Actions. On this date, every member of staff will receive an email with a link to access an online programme encouraging every one of us to take action that will contribute to environmental sustainability. Because of the significant environmental and financial impacts, all staff are expected to complete the programme, which will take around an hour.

A number of information sessions will run during November and relevant colleagues have been contacted and given more details about these sessions. Work is being undertaken to build capacity in the Directorate of Human Resources to provide on-going support and guidance on immigration matters to current, new and prospective international staff.
