Description of Placement:

This placement is part of a study to identify the challenges and needs of First Generation PhD students in the Faculty of Humanities at Manchester. First Generation PhD students are generally defined as PGRs, neither of whose parents attended university and whose siblings did not either.

Studies of First Gen. PhDs in the USA have identified areas where universities could improve their support (targeted recruitment, financial and academic aid, and psychological support). There are no such studies in UK Higher Education.

Expected Tasks and Outcomes:

- To get familiar with literature on First Gen. PhDs and define familial parameters of the definition of First Gen.
- To draft a questionnaire, checking that it is internally and externally robust, to do a sample run, to revise and send out to all PGRs by mid-March
- To collect and analyse data in April and May
- To present data at a workshop and roundtable (dates to be determined) in May or June

Specific Skills/Experience/Training Required for the Placement:

Experience with questionnaire design as well as data collection/analysis strongly preferred Knowledge of PG education issues and policies in the UK would be a plus

Training and experience expected to be gained through the placement:

The selected candidate will be working with Dr Steven Jones (SEED) and Dr Jérôme Brillaud (SALC). The placement will offer the opportunity to conduct a study from the initial phase to the presentation of findings.
