### **Please note -**

When choosing the course units you wish to take you must ensure you choose:

- 120 credits
- Minimum of 50 credits of course units in each semester
- Maximum of 70 credits of course units in each semester

The semester in which a course unit is taught is identified by the last digit in the course code (eg HIST10101 = Sem. 1). A 0 (zero) final digit indicates the course unit is taught across both semesters.

You will not be able to select your own courses via self-service, so will have to contact your administrator via email ([history.administrator@manchester.ac.uk](mailto:history.administrator@manchester.ac.uk)) with your course unit selections.

Students who choose this option would submit half the assessment for 15 rather than 30 credits (details to be supplied in the course unit guide at the beginning of the semester), but would still be expected to attend the weekly 3-hour seminar.
