### PLEASE NOTE:

When selecting your course units you must ensure you take:

- 120 credits overall (including any core courses)
- 60 credits in each semester (NB. you may, if you are choosing 10 credit Free Choice courses, take a maximum of 70 and minimum of 50 credits in either semester)
- As a joint honours student, you must ensure that you take a minimum of 40 and a maximum of 80 credits in each subject. If you choose to take 40 credits in one subject of your Joint Honours programme, you must take a minimum of 60 credits in the other subject.

### HELPFUL HINTS:

- The semester a course is taught in is identified by the last digit in the course code e.g. CLAH30220. A '0' identifies the course unit is taught over both semesters, a '1' indicates Semester 1 and '2' indicates Semester 2
- To enrol on any of the course units outlined in your programme regulation use the Self Service area of Campus Solutions
- Please check the timetable for courses that you choose to ensure that there are not any clashes
