You must be registered for 120 credits exactly. A minimum of 50 credits or a maximum of 70 credits can be taken in one semester. The credits for a full year unit are weighted evenly across both semesters.

As a joint honours student, you must ensure that if you choose to take 40 credits in one subject of your Joint Honours programme, you must take a minimum of 60 credits in the other subject.

### Important note

There are some AMBS accounting and finance assessments that may have to be completed on campus should you wish to qualify for professional accreditation/exemptions. These assessments may only be available when on campus assessments are possible and you may choose to wait until such time to undertake these. Please note that if you opt to do this it may have an impact on the duration of your degree. If this will affect a course you are taking AMBS will be in touch with you closer to the assessment period.
