Please note when choosing the course units you wish to take you must ensure you choose:

- a minimum of 100 credits at Level 1 or higher
- a minimum of 80 credits in the named subject
- a minimum of 50 credits and a maximum of 70 credits per semester
- a total of 120 credits per year
- a maximum of 20 credits at any neighbouring level (e.g. Level 1 units in Second Year)
- no more or no less credits than stated from each list

Helpful hints:

- ✓ Course codes ending in '1' are taught in the first semester, those ending in '2' are taught in the second semester, and those ending in '0' are taught over both semesters
- ✓ Please check the timetable for courses you choose to ensure that you do not have any clashes

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

- In order to progress to the second year of the programme, it is necessary to pass the second semester of your compulsory core language unit with a mark of 40 or above. It is also necessary to pass at least 60 more credits with a mark of 40 or above, and a further 40 credits with a mark of 30 or above. You must pass at least 40 credits at the first attempt (i.e. not through resits). Please see your School Handbook for more information.
