**After completing your selection, you must ensure that you have chosen:**

- a total of 120 credits
- a minimum of 100 credits at Level 3
- a maximum of 80 credits and a minimum of 40 credits in each named subject
- a minimum of 50 credits per semester
- a maximum of 70 credits per semester
- no more or no less credits as stated from each list

\*\* Language course units may include 0 credit components to deliver the full teaching schedule, these units are compulsory and required as a part of the credited course unit.

- ✓ Course codes ending in '1' are taught in the first semester, those ending in '2' are taught in the second semester and those ending in '0' are taught over both semesters
- ✓ Please check the timetable for courses you choose to ensure that you do not have any clashes.

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**Step 4: FREE CHOICE UNITS (0 - 40 Credits)**

Subject to the approval of the Programme Director and fulfilment of the steps above, you are permitted to take a maximum of 0-40 credits free choice if you have not reached the required 120 credits for the year. You can find the full list of free choice units from the Courses Tab within My Manchester [login.manchester.ac.uk](http://login.manchester.ac.uk)

**PLEASE NOTE** - when selecting your free choice course unit:

- No more than 20 credits of Free Choice units per year may be taken outside of the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures. Within SALC, you cannot take more than 20 credits free choice from the **same** subject area, with the exception of SALC/LALC coded units.
- For subject areas in the School of Arts, Languages and Cultures and University College (UCOL), the course unit must be at Level 2 or 3, (please note that this does not include LEAP units, see below). Please note:
  - where a UCOL unit is a language unit (e.g. Arabic and Mandarin) the LEAP rules below apply.
  - you can only choose a Level 2 or 3 unit as free choice.
- For subject areas elsewhere in the University, the course unit must be at Level 2 or 3.

With the permission of **BOTH** your Academic Advisor and Programme Director students studying at Post A-Level language (**if studying two languages both must be Post A-Level**) can select **LEAP** course units (units offered by the University Language Centre) provided that no more than three languages are studied in any one year. LEAP units must be applied for directly through the LEAP office. You can only take LEAP units coded at your current level of study. E.g. Level 1 – ULFR10010, Level 2 - ULFR20110, Level 3 – ULFR30030. Your performance on LEAP will be monitored, and, where relevant, you may be advised to discontinue with the study of the additional language in the subsequent year of study at the recommendation of your Academic Advisor or Programme Director.

THE ONLY EXCEPTIONS FOR THE ABOVE RULE ARE

With the permission of **BOTH** your Academic Advisor and Programme Director some students can select specific **LEAP** course units:

- **Chinese Studies students may take Korean from Level 1**
- **Japanese Studies students may take Korean from Level 1**
- **Arabic and Middle Eastern Studies students may take Persian from Level 1 if offered**
- **Russian and Eastern European Studies students may take Polish from Level 1**
