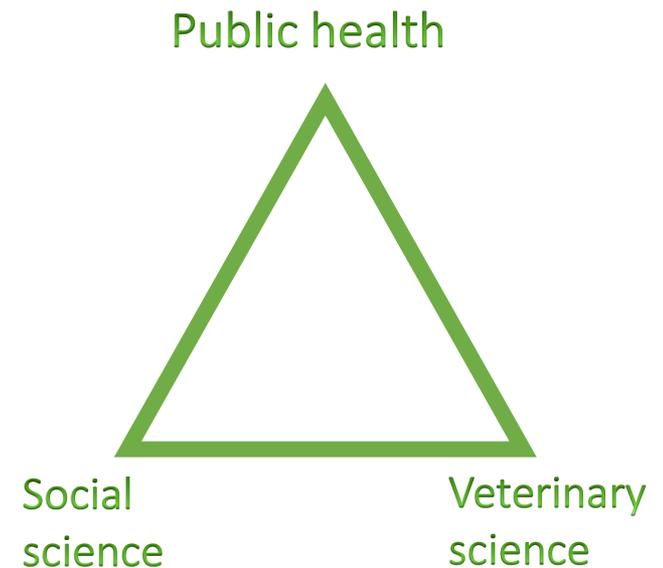

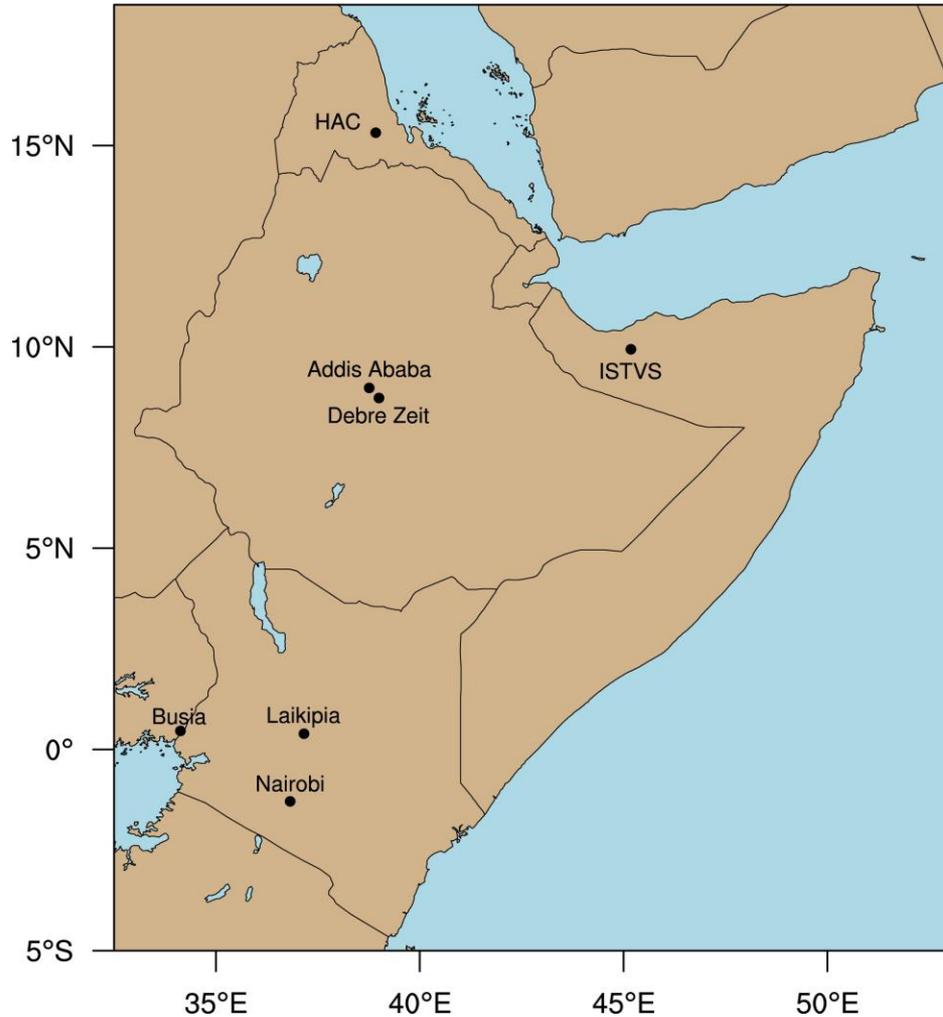
Challenge-led

- My first thought – resurrect failed PhD programme submitted to Wellcome Trust
- Liverpool has strong track record in **One Health**
- Have worked in Kenya and Ethiopia – part of the Horn of Africa
- OH – Ho?





- UoL has a major ‘research footprint’ in Kenya and Ethiopia
- Aim to strengthen research capability in both countries
- Reach into Somalia and Eritrea would be novel and challenging



- We already had numerous partners in Kenya and Ethiopia but:
 - Too “safe”
 - Cannot justify the name HORN
- Needed to find partners in Eritrea and Somalia
 - Proactive - searching internet, author searches etc
- Eritrean partner (HAC) - found through personal contact with an Eritrean politician
- Somalia partner (ISTVS) – found via Kenya contact

Combination of building on existing partnerships, and adding new, exciting partnerships, feels just right for GCRF

- Insisted that the University funded a visit to Ethiopia and Kenya to meet partners
- Four major benefits:
 - Established partnerships
 - Presentation needed – so clarified my ideas
 - Got feedback
 - Evidence of engagement with partners at conception stage





One Health
is the concept that the health & well-being of people are linked to the health of animals and the environment.

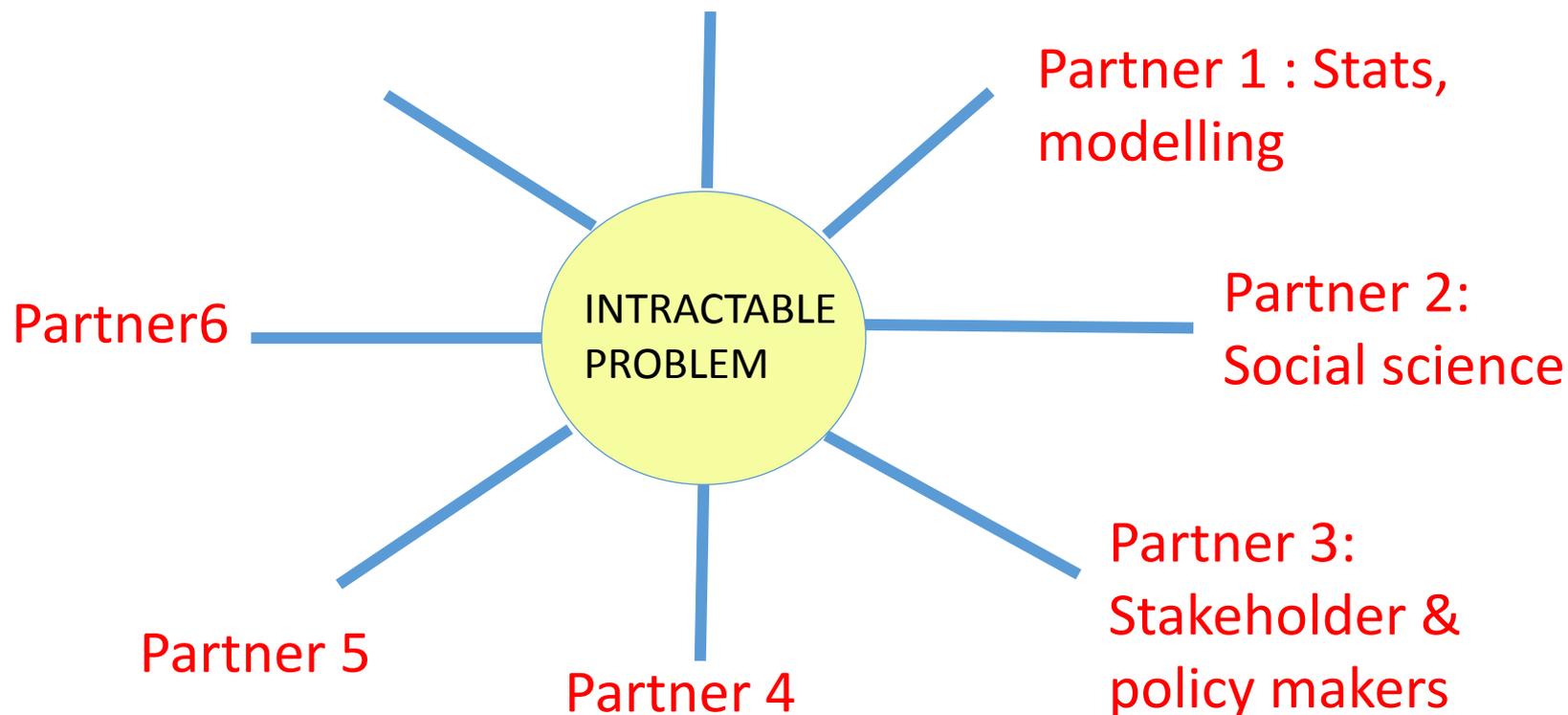
- Get help with slides by someone ‘visual/arty’
- Choose panel very carefully
 - Think of gender, nationalities etc
 - Need to cover all areas of project
- Everyone needs to know their area
 - Supply prepared answers
 - Learn to hand over questions – and to then let them answer
- Practice
 - And practice
 - And practice again....

- Research capacity assessments
- Training of non-research staff – *strengthen institution*
 - *Technicians, Leaders, support staff*
- Training of research staff
 - Formal courses, workshops, summer schools, e-platforms
- Research placements
 - Promote mobility
 - Supervision and mentoring by Liverpool academics
- Network-building activities

- Problem-focussed
 - Improving human health & livelihoods by improving animal health – in a region where dependence on animals is probably the highest in world
- Research excellence
 - Interdisciplinary research (medical-veterinary-social)
- Impact
 - Training of researchers
 - Strengthening of institutions
- Partnership building
 - Aims to build network across region
 - Mobility of researchers



- You have complete freedom over discipline
 - So give “them” what they want – a Hub
- DON'T just resurrect a failed proposal and call it a IDH.
- THINK about how your idea can fit into a “hub”
