

FBMH Teaching Opportunity: Recruitment of Group Tutors for Personal Excellence Path (PEP)

Personal Excellence Path is an important part of the MB ChB programme. Students in Year 1 have group teaching sessions about their PEP. This role is to support two groups of approx. 6 students each in their development of an academic poster and mark short reports (3-4 pages) by individual students.

Key Responsibilities and Resources:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Facilitate 2 group meetings with each group and provide support across the PEP study period by responding to queries from groups and individuals. • Provide feedback on poster topic and on draft of individual reports. • Mark individual reports (3-4 pages)

Essential Knowledge Skills and Experience:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Demonstrate an understanding of the undergraduate medicine MB ChB Programme or equivalent • Academic appointment at the University with relevant teaching experience. Good group facilitation skills. • Holds a University of Manchester academic contract in FBMH or NHS medical or other professional healthcare contract. • Prepared/presented a poster at a scientific conference, and made a significant contribution to a peer-reviewed scientific or clinical publication. • Some familiarity with one or more of the areas of the poster topics (<i>Human Development; Cancer/Immunology; Cardiorespiratory Fitness; Mind and Movement; Nutrition, Metabolism and the Endocrine System; Public Health and Global Health</i>) • Able to meet students at the University, during the normal student working day
