

Further information on presentations

Living in Manchester

Information on how to get around Manchester, things to see and do, where to shop and how to make the best of your time in our dynamic university city are all covered by this session.

International Society

Take time to find out more about the International Society, a charitable organisation which is unique to the city of Manchester. Sam Harris will inform you about the work that the charity conducts for you as students including extra-curricular activities, events and day trips as well as allowing you to meet many likeminded people from across the globe.

Health matters

This session is led by a qualified nurse from the University Student Occupational Health Centre and will provide information about the University's health provision and give you simple tips for keeping healthy and how to seek help if you are unwell.

Support services on campus

Find out about huge the range of support services available. Representatives from the International Advice Team, Students Union and Academic Advisory Service will be on hand to provide you information concerning a whole range of services available to you as a student at The University of Manchester.

Police and Personal Safety

This session focuses on the role of the police and how to look after your personal safety and property. The session will be split into two talks, one from our campus police officer and one from our Crime Reduction Advisor. Certain categories of students must register with the police shortly after arrival in the UK - Please check the stamp put in your passport when you enter UK to see if you need to register with the police.

A guide to study in the UK

The UK academic system may be very different from that in your home country. This session will cover what is expected of you during your study time at Manchester whilst also giving you information on what you can expect in the way of support from our academics.

English Language support (optional session)

The session provides an opportunity to find out how the University can help you improve your English during your studies.





IT Sign-up (optional drop-in session)

If you have not yet completed your IT sign up or have a question regarding the sign up process then you will be able to drop by the computer cluster situated at University Place during this period. We will have both Purple People and staff on hand to help you during the sign up process, however, you will need to bring you UID Number (this is your student number) with you.

Guidance on registration for Erasmus Students and Guidance on registration for Study Abroad and Exchange Students

These sessions detail registration information specific to the category of student. Each session will also provide further information your academic programmes, credit/course loads, timetables, attendance, assessment, transcripts and academic support. Manchester Business School (MBS) students please not that your registration procedures will differ from those detailed in these sessions. These will be covered in the MBS induction programme.

Campus Tours (optional)

Student assistants will be leading the Campus Tours, familiarising you with the layout of the Oxford Road Campus, pointing out important buildings such as the Library, your department and catering outlets. Please ensure you meet at the specified meeting point.

Students with families (optional)

This session is an informal questions and answers session on the subject of childcare, schooling, accommodation and healthcare. At 15.00 you will be joined by other students who have their families with them in Manchester who will be more than happy to share their experiences with you.

Vaccinations

Meningitis C is a potentially serious disease which has a higher prevalence amongst student populations. The University of Manchester is offering to vaccinate all international students against Meningitis C free of charge, and is also offering to vaccinate students against Measles, Mumps and Rubella (the MMR vaccine) at the same session. A vaccination session, staffed by fully qualified medical staff, will be held in the Occupational Health Centre.
