Period Poverty

One in ten women in the UK are unable to buy menstrual products. They are stuck using rags, socks, newspaper, and tissues as substitutes. Mental and physical health is at risk, education is disrupted. The stigma surrounding menstruation means many women are suffering without help. Campaigns such as #FreePeriods are protesting outside Downing Street, and Amika George started a petition for children entitled to free school meals to have access to free menstrual products. Efforts like these have resulted in the government assigning funds of 1.5 million to tackle period poverty. No woman should feel ashamed during her period.
