Job Details

The University of Manchester (UoM Sport) are looking to recruit an experienced football coach to coach, manage, organise and performance monitor the University of Manchester's Men's Football Club and increase their performance in British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS). The primary responsibility of the role will be the coaching and management of the 2nd team who currently play in BUCS 3A North. The successful candidate will be an FA Licensed Coach holding a minimum FA Level 2 Certificate in Football Coaching.

Main Duties & Responsibilities

- Deliver an effective coaching programme that helps improve the performance of the Men's Football Club and deliver a first class experience for the playing members.
- Lead sessions (fulfilling the 2nd team coach position in most instances unless otherwise agreed) and work as part of the club's 'coaching team'
- Attend and manage BUCS fixtures of the 2nd team or assist another club team in the event of no 2nd team fixture. This requires availability on Wednesday afternoons.
- Assist the Club and team captains (and other coaches where appropriate) to select playing squads and maintain transparent selection processes and pathways between squads. This will require attendance at trials.
- Assist in recruiting students to engage with coaching opportunities, providing opportunities where appropriate to coach within the club.
- Provide regular information and status reports, as agreed with the Football Development Officer and Coach and Club Development Coordinator, on team and club performance and progress.
- Record player attendance at all training sessions and games.
- Work closely with the Football Development Officer and committee members to assist with the development of the men's game at The University of Manchester.
- To ensure all sessions comply with Health and Safety and work within an equal opportunities framework.
