

Our city accommodation is located close to the city centre and at the heart of our teaching campus.

### Average journey to campus:

-  10 minutes on foot

## ● Victoria Park (*seven sites*)

Leafy and tranquil, Victoria Park is just a brisk walk or a short bike ride away from campus.

-  18 minutes on foot
-  5 minutes by bike
-  6 minutes by bus

## ● Fallowfield (*nine sites*)

A vibrant, mixed residential suburb, Fallowfield offers plenty of amenities. It's also within easy reach of the city centre.
