

Do you/have you had any of the following conditions or treatments?

- Severe Asthma (requiring regular use of more than one type of inhaler) ● Allergic Asthma (mould in particular) ● Type 1 Diabetes ● IBS that has significantly affected your life ● Schistosomiasis Infection ● Prostate Cancer
- Endometrial Cancer (primary or secondary) ● Are you taking HRT?
- Are you undergoing peritoneal dialysis for kidney disease?

Would you be willing to tell us about your experiences of it?

A patient's perspective of a condition is often very different to a scientist's. By talking to University masters students who are studying the immune system, you could help them to understand the impact that their research could have on people's lives. You could also help them to explain their research findings to a general audience.

The **closing date** for expressing interest is **Wednesday 13th March 2019**

Who are we looking for and what do we need you to do?

We are seeking 13 patients/members of the public who have ever been diagnosed with one of the conditions listed above and would be happy to:

- Talk about their experiences of the condition to a small group of students
- Listen to student presentations about their research

You will be given £60 (**£30 for attending each event**) to thank you for your time. Payment will be made into your bank account. Reasonable travel expenses will be reimbursed on the day and refreshments will be provided.

Who will you be talking to?

Masters students from the University of Manchester who are studying the immune system.

When would we need you and for how long?

We are planning two events and need you to be available on both dates:

- Wednesday 27th March: 2pm – 4pm (with an optional 1pm start if you would like to join us for lunch)
- Tuesday 3rd September: 2 - 4pm

What would you need to do?

Wednesday 27th 2 – 4pm

There will be 13 patients and 20 postgraduate students in this session. You will be asked to talk to a small group of students (maximum of 3) about your experience of your condition or treatment.

This could include: when it started, how it has progressed, any symptoms, how your condition has been treated, how it affects your life, including your ways of coping.

The student(s) will ask you some questions to help them to understand your condition and the impact of their research. They will also want to tell you about the research project they are planning and about some of the science behind your symptoms. This is to help them practice explaining scientific ideas to members of the public.

You will be free to ask the student(s) any questions that you have.

You are welcome to join us at 1pm for lunch if you would like to.

Tuesday 3rd September 2 – 4pm

This session is for the students to share their research findings with you in short informal presentations. You will also be given the opportunity to ask questions and give feedback. This is really important to us, as explaining scientific concepts to the public is a vital skill for our students.

Tea, coffee and cake will be provided at this event.

Members of University staff and a patient representative will be present at both sessions. We can discuss the events over the phone to help you prepare and can spend some time with you immediately after the session if you would like to talk through the experience.

What should you do if you are interested?

Please include:

- Which condition/treatment is relevant to you
- When you were first diagnosed
- How your experience of this condition/treatment has impacted your daily life
- Why you would like to talk to students about their research

What happens after I have applied?

If you are invited to take part:

We will notify you via e-mail or telephone.

We will ask you to provide us with the following:

- Confirmation that you can attend both meetings.
- Any accessibility needs.
- Your mobile number – in case we need to contact you once you have set off for the session.
- Details of how you will be travelling to the event and the likely cost, so that we can ensure the cash is available to reimburse you on the day.
- Details of any special dietary requirements.

If you are unsuccessful on this occasion:

We will also ask if you are happy for us to keep your details on file and pass them on to other teams within the University of Manchester who also conduct similar patient involvement projects.
