Are you ready for assessments?

Are you ready for your elective?

Skills Update

You will remember that in order to complete the year satisfactorily you need to have completed all of your UPSAs and Prescribing and Medicine Safety (PMS) skills by the end of Block 8.

At this point in the semester please take the time to check your dashboard ensuring that you are on track to demonstrate competence in these important skills and have the eforms submitted. Now's the time to formulate a plan to get everything signed off.

Assessment

Following on from the Year 4 board of examiners we wanted to share some of the winter OSCE results with you. Reviewing station scores the internal consistency was high with no outlier stations using Cronbach's alpha. This means that station scores correlated well with each other and indicates good reliability. Our external examiner praised the smooth running of the OSCE and the pre OSCE quality assurance process (blueprinting scrutiny, emendation) and post OSCE analysis.

The pass marks for both OSCE A and OSCE B were similar to that of previous years. There were more Distinctions and Honours grades awarded than in previous years, so particular congratulations to everyone who achieved this.

Many of you will have started preparation for your next OSCE. It might be helpful to review the OSCE tips we included in the Oct Y4MR. Please remember that the best way to prepare for OSCEs is to get involved in the clinical environment when on placement. Don't forget to make sure you are confident with all the core and procedural skills and remember to use the Y4 iBook.

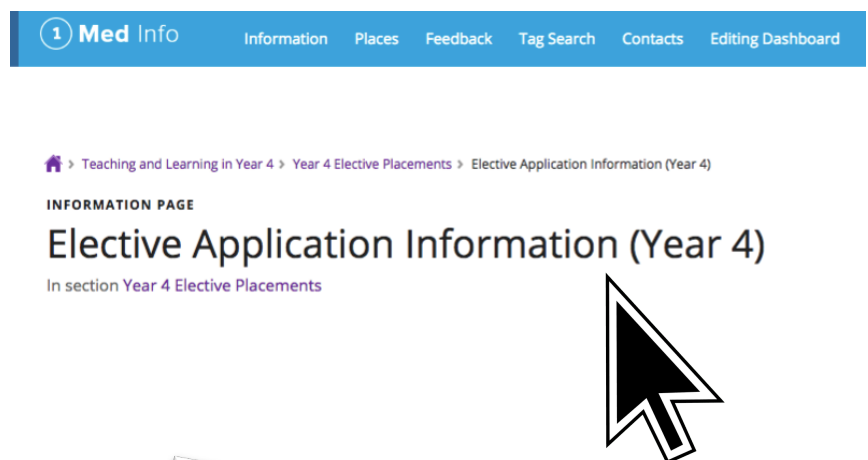
