Personal Excellence Pathway



What is it?

The Quality and Evidence Personal Excellence Pathway (QEPEP) is an exciting opportunity for students to be involved in a quality improvement project (QIP) at your practice, as well as promoting general practice as a career.

Students self-select community projects within conventional medical fields or beyond. Examples include cardiology, cancer care, paediatrics, palliative care, sports medicine, law and ethics, travel medicine, global health, arts and medicine and much more.

We encourage and support supervisors to align their project offers with a principle of sustainable healthcare. More information is available in the Green QEPEP Toolkit.

What do I have to do?

- Meet the students at the start of the placement
- Help identify and plan a suitable project.
- Timetable administrative time, project supervision (1 hour per week) and support the student in carrying out their project.
- Mark the completed project according to defined marking criteria. Also provide feedback on attendance and engagement.

How?

You need to timetable activities that are relevant to the student's QIP. It is optimum for the students to do 3 days of educational activities in the practice. However the timetable is negotiable between student and supervisor, dependent on the needs of the quality improvement project.

They will produce one of the following assignments:

Quality and Evidence (QE) report e.g. audit or other piece of quality improvement work

or

Lay document and associated work report e.g. patient information leaflet.

When?

QEPEP modules last for 4 weeks running from:

- Mon 24th Mar Thurs 17th Apr

and

Tues 22nd Apr - Fri 16th May 2025.

We will canvass availability at the start of the academic year, so early expression of interest is recommended to ensure that your QEPEP module will be available for student selection.

How much?

Payment is £1600 per student and there is the opportunity to take more than one QEPEP student per placement.
