Planning your day







Travelling by train

Arriving from Piccadilly Train Station

For visitors travelling via Piccadilly Train Station, Student Ambassadors will be able to provide you with walking directions to the Oxford Road Campus which takes about 20 minutes.

There will also be Student Ambassadors along the route to help direct you.

Alternatively, the University has arranged to operate a shuttle bus between Piccadilly Station and Oxford Road Campus. The service is free of charge and will operate at the times below. Please follow signs for the taxi rank and Fairfield Street and you will be directed to the bus stop. Due to local traffic and the popularity of the service, please allow 45 minutes for the journey.

A taxi ride from the station will take approximately 15 minutes and cost around £10.

Arriving from Victoria Station

Victoria Station is approximately a five minutes' walk to Shudehill Interchange where you can travel on the 18 bus from Stand E (the bus marked Manchester Royal Infirmary – occasionally departing from Stand C). This will drop you right in the heart of campus.

Alternatively, Victoria is approximately a 15 minutes' walk from Piccadilly Gardens. Here there are frequent bus services to the Oxford Road Campus. Services include the 41, 42, 43, 142 and 143.

Taxis are also available outside the station, with fares ranging between £15 – 20 depending on traffic.

Arriving from Oxford Road Station

To get to the Oxford Road Campus, go down the station approach to Oxford Road and turn right. The Campus is a 10 to 15 minute walk. Alternatively, you can catch a bus from outside the Principal Hotel to the Oxford Road Campus. Please speak to one of our Student Ambassadors who will be based at Oxford Road Station.


Enjoy the city



THESE ARE OUR TIPS ON MAKING THE MOST OUT OF YOUR DAY:

- Some sessions may be limited to one student and one guest when busy.

- Most sessions finish ten minutes before the scheduled finish time to allow you time to get to the next session.
- Wear sensible shoes and bring a raincoat or umbrella. Bring a bag for any literature you might pick up.
- Don't forget to make time for lunch. There are plenty of outlets around campus that are open all day, so you can have lunch whenever suits you.
