GET YOUR BEARINGS

● City (six sites)

Our city accommodation is located close to the city centre and at the heart of our teaching campus.

Average journey to campus:

- 10 minutes on foot
- 3 minutes by bike
- 5 minutes by bus

● Victoria Park (six sites)

Leafy and tranquil, Victoria Park is just a brisk walk or a short bike ride away from campus.

- 18 minutes on foot
- 5 minutes by bike
- 6 minutes by bus

● Fallowfield (seven sites)

A vibrant, mixed residential suburb, Fallowfield offers plenty of amenities. It's also within easy reach of the city centre.

- 30 minutes on foot
- 8 minutes by bike

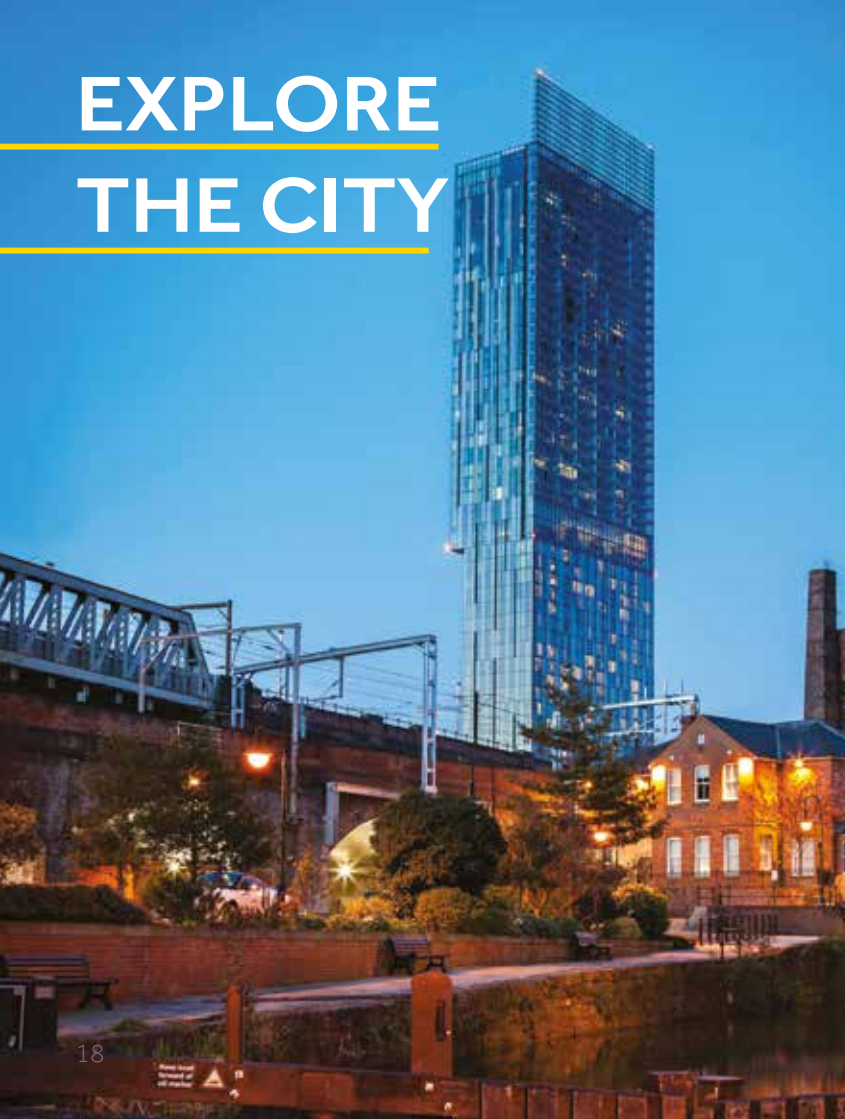

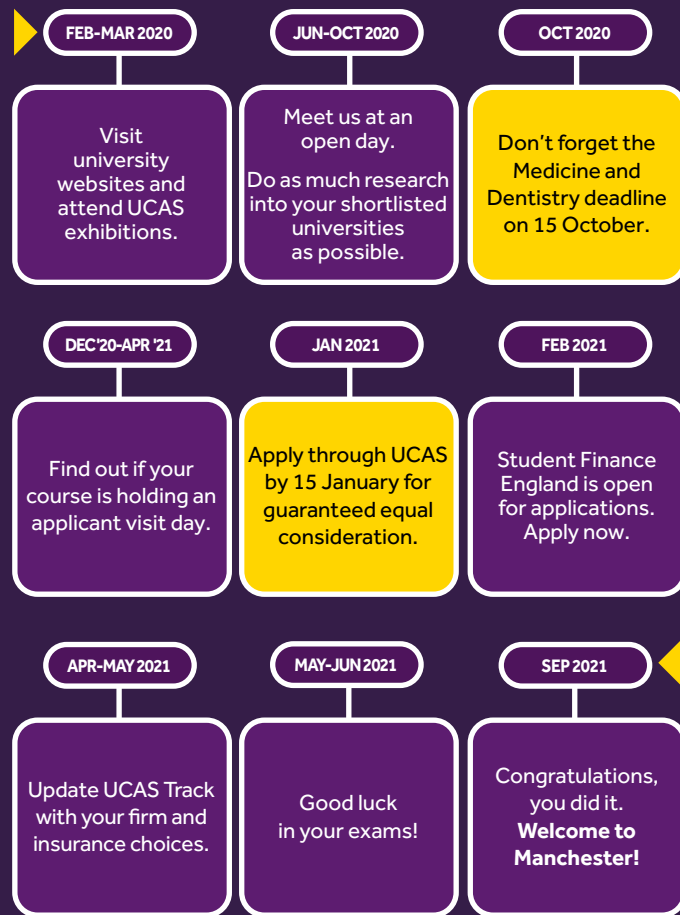
