



COURSE DELIVERY

- > The course is delivered exclusively online which means you can fit it around your life with no need to travel to attend lectures or seminars, or keep to a strict timetable. You can study in your breaks at work, or at home on the evenings and weekends whatever works for you!

WHAT YOU WILL STUDY

You can choose to complete each unit as a standalone 15-credit CPD unit, or complete all four to make up a PGCert.

Fundamentals of Skin Ageing

- Understand the structure and function of healthy skin, focusing on cells and extracellular matrix.
- Explore the molecular mechanisms of skin ageing, including photobiology and sun exposure.
- Develop scientific knowledge about the mechanism of action of non-surgical topical anti-ageing treatments.

Injectables in Aesthetic Medicine


- Build skills in evidence-based approaches to treatment including botulinum toxin and dermal filler treatments.
- Critically analyse the latest research and practice in this area to offer high-quality, patient-centred care.

Skin Rejuvenation

- Consider the scientific basis and indications for the latest skin rejuvenation techniques.
- Understand the importance of evidencebased practice.
- Analyse different skin rejuvenation techniques and their appropriateness for individuals.

Lasers in Aesthetic Medicine

- Enhance skills in assessing and managing patients undergoing treatment with laser devices.
- Develop sound critical analysis skills through e-learning, discussion forums and expert-led tutorials.

Entry requirements

Candidates for the Skin Ageing and Aesthetic Medicine Postgraduate Certificate course will need to hold a medical or dental degree (eg MBBS, BDS, LDS, MBChB) or overseas equivalent from an institution that is recognised and approved by the UK General Medical Council (GMC) or the General Dental Council (GDC) or Nurse Prescriber's who have successfully completed an Nursing and Midwifery Council Independent Nurse Prescribing Course (also known as a v200 or v300 course) and are registered with the Nursing and Midwifery Council as an Independent Prescriber.

English language requirements

- IELTS score of 6.5 overall, with 6.0 in writing, or equivalent.
- TOEFL internet-based score of 90, with a minimum score of 22 in each component; computer-based score of 230, with a minimum score of 6.0 for the Test of Written English; or a paper-based score of 575.


