Sackville Street Building

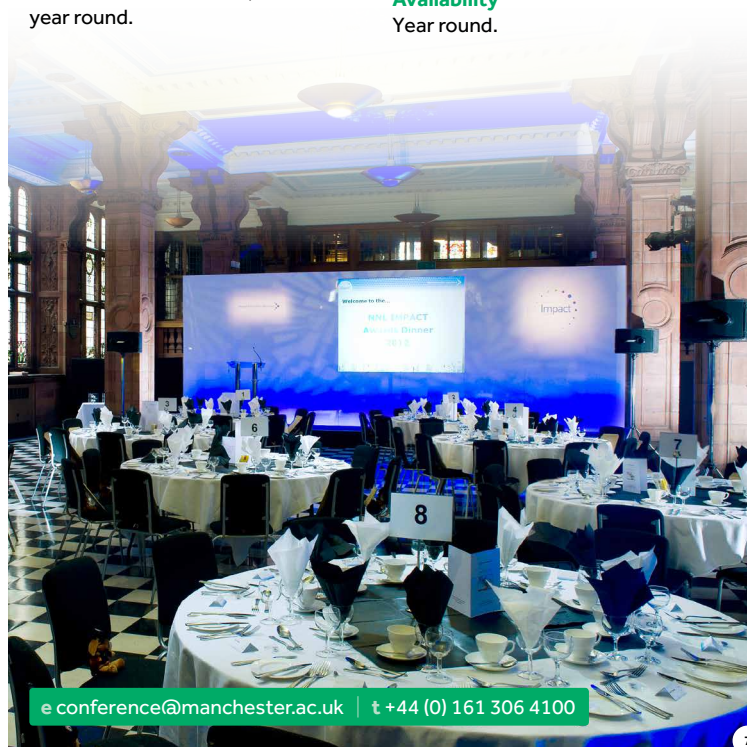
