## Scenario 1

Student fails 10, 20, 30 or 40 credits with marks between $30-39 \%$ and no other fails Compensated - Pass and Proceed

## Scenario 2

Student fails 10 credits with marks between $30-39 \%$ and 10 credits with mark of $29 \%$ or below
Student has a mix of resits and compensation.
Student resits the course $29 \%$ or below; the course with the mark between $30-39 \%$ is compensated (Student has 30 credits of compensation remaining for resit results)

## Scenario 3

Student fails 20 credits with marks between $30-39 \%$ and 20 credits with mark of $29 \%$ or below
Student has a mix of resits and compensation.
Student resits the courses $29 \%$ or below; the courses with the mark between 30-39\% are compensated (Student has 20 credits of compensation remaining for resit results)

## Scenario 4

Student fails 30 credits with marks between $30-39 \%$ and 10 credits with a mark of $29 \%$ or below
Student has a mix of resits and compensation. Student resits the course with the mark of $29 \%$ or below; the 30 credits of marks between $30-39 \%$ are compensated (Student has 10 credits remaining for compensation at resit stage)

## Scenario 5

Student fails 50 credits (or more) with 40 credits of marks between $30-39 \%$ and 10 credits (or more) with a mark of $29 \%$ or below

Student has a mix of resits and compensation. Student resits the course with the mark of $29 \%$ or below; the 40 credits of marks between $30-39 \%$ are compensated (Student has no credits remaining for compensation at resit stage and therefore must pass the resit(s) with a mark of $40 \%$ or more)
