- Act now!






Using careers events

- Your chance to meet employers and ask questions
- Enhances your application
 - Why did decide to you apply to us?
- Research before you go. Ask informed questions, not:
 - 'What jobs do you have?'
 - 'What does your company do?'
- Can you find something you have in common with the organisation?

Good opening questions

- On your website, I noticed... can you tell me more about...
- I was reading on your website that placement students are involved in xxx. Can you tell me more about what I would be doing? I am studying a module related to this.
- What specific skills do you look for?
- What type of projects have your placement students done in the past?
- I really like that you have a culture where staff can contribute ideas. Can you tell me more about what it's like working there?




Use your contacts – everyone has them!

- Friends, family, tutors, work colleagues...
- Let them know what you are looking for.
 - Information and advice, not just jobs
- Do they know anyone in your chosen field/role?
- Always follow up leads and say thank you
- Well targeted CV and covering letter
- If you impress, it could turn into something more

- Part-time £6.19 £6.50 +


Some work experience is unpaid

Tips for successful applications

- Research the employer
- Tailor your application each time
- Demonstrate evidence of your skills
- Spell & grammar check and check again*


