Audiologists work with people who have hearing and balance disorders. If you like interacting with people, are fascinated by cutting-edge technology and want diverse career options, then audiology may be for you.

Our degree gives you practitioner-level training and an accredited qualification which allows you to work within both the NHS and the private sector.

Most of our graduates become clinical audiologists or hearing-aid audiologists, but others have gone on to work with hearing aid manufacturers and dispensing companies, universities, charities and schools. 95% of recent graduates are in work or further study six months after graduation.
