

Academic Adviser FAQS for the Faculty of Humanities

Your role as an academic advisor can be very influential in supporting students at this challenging time when the typical ways they may gain work experience, get advice and explore options may be very different. Some students have had to miss out on planned opportunities such as placements, others are considering further study rather than graduate jobs, and some are just feeling very uncertain about where to get started with 'what next?'

This FAQ sheet aims to assist you in these conversations, by helping you signpost students to Careers Service support and wider resources. This advice is not specific to a particular subject or year group, but instead aims to help address the key themes of queries and concerns arising at this time with accessible and practical information and advice.
