ENTREPRENEUR: INNOVATOR AND RISK-TAKER

Successful entrepreneurs are characterised by their ability to take risks in order to generate innovations. By exercising judgement, they develop those innovations into viable businesses.

Entrepreneur: Innovator and Risk-taker focuses on how entrepreneurs generate the ideas to create and grow their firm. You will learn to recognise business opportunities and evaluate them by examining successes and failures from the past and the present.

Lectures 1 and 2 explore entrepreneurial characteristics and idea generation. Lectures 3-8 examine the impact of entrepreneurs in the sectors of clothing and homeware, beauty, agriculture and natural resources, transport and communication, music and technology. Successful entrepreneurs often grow their firm through further innovations. However, there are barriers to growth, including the financing of additional research and development and the management of employees. Lectures 9-12 examine the challenges and consider how both large and small firms can overcome them.
