### PLEASE NOTE:

When selecting your course units you must ensure you take:

- 120 credits overall (including any core courses)
- Minimum of 50 credits per semester
- Maximum of 70 credits per semester
- Minimum 100 credits must be Level 3
- Joint Hons students may take up to a maximum of 20 credits at Level 2 within Religions & Theology or Anthropology (students at Level 3 are not permitted to take Level 1 credits), subject to approval by the Programme Director
- As a joint honours student, you must ensure that you take a minimum of 40 and a maximum of 80 credits in each subject. If you choose to take 40 credits in one subject of your Joint Honours programme, you must take a minimum of 60 credits in the other subject.

### HELPFUL HINT:

- ✓ The semester a course is taught in is identified by the last digit in the course code. E.G CLAH30220. A '0' identifies the course unit is taught over both semesters, a '1' indicates Semester 1 and '2' indicates Semester 2
