

How to include MAP on your UCAS form

When you do come to submit your real UCAS form through your school or college, **providing you have passed MAP**, if you are applying to The University of Manchester you must put 'MAP' in the further details section for each course you apply to at The University of Manchester. An example is given below.

Number of days: It's difficult to calculate the programme in days as obviously it takes place across a period of months and different students take part in different things.
