


Headline news

- 1) Between Monday 27th July 2020 and Sunday 24th January 2021 there have been 151,123 study space bookings made by 11,104 people.

Number of bookings by year and week and by academic career and level




Number of bookings by academic career and level




Bookings by school over time 21/09/2020 24/01/2021

Number of bookings by year and week number and by school









Library study space bookings over time at the Alan Gilbert Learning Commons (AGLC) and Main Library

Booking numbers are shown below from Monday 28th December 2020 to Sunday 24th January 2021.









Online library sessions take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays






Stopford Library (morning sessions)




Online (morning sessions)
