



# How to Save a Life – answer sheet

### Questions and answers (red + provided in video)

Scenario 1: You are a newly qualified doctor on your way to your GP clinic this morning. You notice a middle aged man collapse near a busy road. What do you do?

- a) Run straight towards the collapsed man and see if he responds?
- b) Check to see if there is any danger nearby?

# \*Always assess the situation to check you are not putting yourself/others in danger\*

c) Go to your GP clinic as you have to start work?

### You have 3 minutes as a group to write down what each letter stands for in DRS ABC:

- Danger
- Response
- Shout for help
- Airways
- Breathing
- Call for help + CPR
- Defibrillation

# Scenario 2: You are a newly qualified doctor on holiday in Italy. You notice the person in the table opposite you start to choke. What do you do?

## a) Get the person choking to cough?

- b) Ask the person choking to speak?
- c) Slap the person choking on their back?
- d) Continue eating your pizza.

### QUIZ

- 1. What is the first thing you would tell someone choking that can speak, cry, cough or breathe to do to clear the blockage? *Encourage to cough.*
- 2. What are the signs of a blocked airway? *Agitation, confusion, blueish, unconscious, confusion.*
